President's Pilot Box: Gordon Collyer

We currently have two new members training for solo check flights, with one ready to solo and waiting on the weather to offer a dry and less windy day. Additionally, a friend of Ernie's who teaches technology classes at Liberty High School has expressed an interest in joining the club. Some of his class members came out on a rainy Saturday and buddy-boxed a few weeks ago (see pictures).





We've hosted the first "Second Saturday" introductory buddy-box day (June 8th) where we announced through Parks and Recreation and "Facebook" that we would have an instructor and training aircraft available to any interested public that wanted to stop by. Late in the 10am to 2pm window we had three youth and a parent come out. All flew. The big unknown this year is the gate situation. For now, we are following Parks and Rec. guidance to not have any gate special arrangements and have non-club visitors walk out to see us. The Boy Scouts are also doing this, and it seems to be workable.

I'm getting close to wrapping up assembling the parts for the 12volt solar charging cabinet for the field. I've bread-boarded the panel, charge controller, storage battery and test charged some flight batteries in my back yard. The 100w rated panel puts out slightly over 6 amps when laid flat. To do yet are: finalization on how/where I'll mount the solar panel (I'm leaning strongly towards a pole mount on one of the sheds posts), and ventilation and flood drainage for the cabinet (see also where to put the holes and keep bugs out). It should come together soon. To use the system you will need a charger that accepts a nominal 11-14 volt input, and a set of 4mm banana plugs that connect to your charger's input power plug. On top of the cabinet there is a fourport breakout box for charger connection via the banana plugs. The charge controller also has a USB port for phone charging, etc., if you want to have those cables on hand. Depending on the storage battery configuration we start with we will likely have between 60-110 amp-hours of capacity. This means the system won't supply enough capacity for an all-day pattern contest. Nor will it support several folks flying 10s 6000mah planes for a long time. But if you charge a few batteries at home, the system should allow you to bring fewer batteries and charge at the field for some additional flights. Down the road, if the system proves useful to enough folks, there will be the possibility of increasing capacity by changing out the storage batteries for more expensive LiFePo4 batteries or perhaps solid-state lithium batteries when they become available. This picture will give you an idea of the cabinet and panel size.



The C-Stars Demonstrations by the Club are scheduled for this Thursday, 13 June at Lenn Model Airpark. The field will be closed to general flying from 9 AM until 2 PM. I will have a full report next month.

Finally, please note: on the agenda for a vote at the June 23rd meeting at the field is the dues increase that the board recommended for consideration earlier in the year and that was previously discussed at the last meeting. Fly when you can, plan to fly when you can't.
